Common name

Rock Sprengelia

Family

Ericaceae

Where found

Wet rock faces and ledges or cliff bases on sandstone. Blue Mountains.

Notes

Shrub to 0.5 m high or sprawling, hairless.. Stems smooth. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, overlapping each other, 0.3–0.85 cm long, 1.5–2.5 mm wide, tips pointed and with a **mucro** to 0.3 mm long, margins **entire**, bases completely sheathing the stems. Flowers white or pinkish, with 5 **erect petals**, each 8–9 mm long, free from each other or joined for 0.2–0.3 mm at the base. Flowers single. Flowering: September–December.

Family was Epacridaceae.
