Common name

Western Stackhousia

Family

Celastraceae

Where found

Woodland, **grassland**, and rocky areas. Mainly in the Sydney area. Occasionally elsewhere.

Notes

Perennial herb to 0.6 m high, hairless. Stems **striate**. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 0.7–3 cm long, 1–2.5 mm wide, **linear**. Flowers yellow-green or pale to deep yellow; tubular, the tube 2–6 mm long, with 5 lobes 1–4 mm long. Flowers in a cylindrical, **spike**-like cluster. Flowering: spring.
