

Plants of South Eastern New South Wales

Common name

Green Five-corners

Family

Ericaceae

Where found

Dry **forest** and **heath**. Coast and ranges north from Thirlmere.

Notes

Shrub usually to 1.8 m high. Fruit dry or slightly fleshy. Branchlets hairy with fine hairs. Leaves **alternating** up the stems, 1.48–3 cm long, 4.7–7.2 mm wide, more or less flat, margins **entire** or fringed with minute hairs; surfaces hairless or the upper surface rough near the base. Flowers translucent green, tubular, the tube 14–25 mm long, with 5 tightly rolled lobes. **Anthers** extending well beyond the flower tube. Flowers single, rarely 2 or 3 together, almost **erect** to horizontal.

Family was Epacridaceae.
