Common name

Moth Bladderwort

Family

Lentibulariaceae

Where found

Coastal **heath** in moist places and shallow water. Sydney area north from the harbour. Rarely elsewhere. Not common.

Notes

Perennial herb, **stoloniferous**. Insect traps on the stems and leaves. Leaves usually 0.5–5 cm long, the smaller leaves **simple**, the larger leaves deeply divided 2-3 times. Flowers dark blue-violet with 2 white streaks at the base of the lower lip, 7–10 mm long, 2-lipped, the upper lip small, sometimes notched, the lower lip fan-shaped. Flowers in a single 2–20-flowered cluster 10–45 cm long. Flowering: February–March
