Common name

Single Bladderwort

Family

Lentibulariaceae

Where found

Wet **heath**, wet rocky shelves, moist stream banks, and swamps. Coast and ranges.

Notes

Probably **perennial** herb to 0.3 m high, **stoloniferous**. Insect traps few, on the **stolons**. Leaves few, 0.4–0.8 cm long, 1–2 mm wide. Flowers mauve to pink, 9–15 mm long, upper lip oval, tip notched; lower lip much larger, broadly oval, with 8–10 short longitudinal ridges, the central ridge 2 sometimes yellow, the **lateral** ridges white. Flowers single or paired. Flowers August–May.
