Batiki blue grass eye spot (207)



Photo 1. Numerous small eye spots with light centres and reddish margins, caused by *Curvularia ischaemi* on batiki blue grass leaves, *Ischaemum indicum*.

Summary

- Distribution unknown. On batiki blue grass. A minor disease.
- Grey spots, 0.5-1 mm, with reddish to purple borders on leaves. Spores develop on the dying leaf tips and dead leaves.
- Cultural control. not practical; best to replant with another species of pasture grass.
- Chemical control: none recommended.
