Family

Fabaceae

Distribution

Occurs in the Darling Ra. from Dwellingup and Marradong S to Nannup and N of Tonebridge, and in the Popanyining–Narrogin area in the adjacent wheatbelt.

Description

Shrub 0.3–0.6 cm high. **Bipinnate leaves persistent** and conspicuous on mature plants; **pinna-rachis** 2–3 cm long; pinnules 5–12 pairs, flat, green to grey-green. Phyllodes 2–6 cm long, 0.5–2 mm wide, flat; **midrib** prominent. Flower-heads creamy yellow to golden. Pods 6–7 mm wide, with **reticulum** obvious (× 10 mag.). Seeds transverse to **oblique**, circular to **elliptic** or **oblong**.

Habitat

Grows on laterite mainly in *Eucalyptus* forest or woodland.
